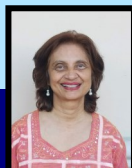

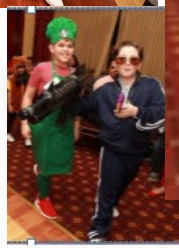

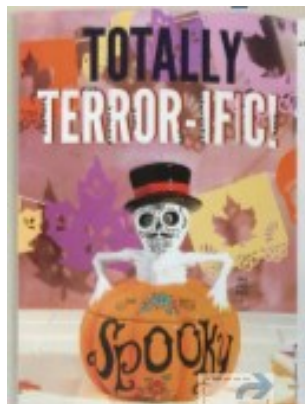

Gerry & Deline D'Costa were the lucky winners of the 50-50. Everyone is invited to their home for Christmas!!!

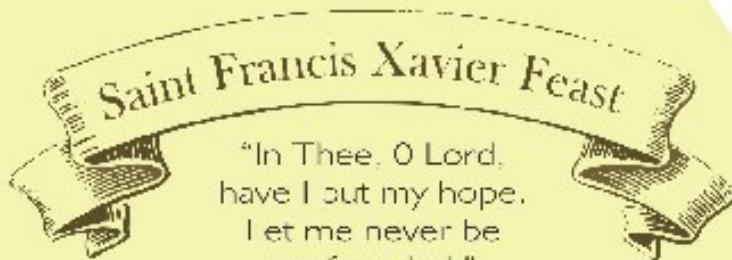
All in all, a night to remember, distinct above everything else for the warm camaraderie and just pure fun that are the hallmarks of our Association events.

1506 Francis Xavier

was born to an aristocratic
family in the kingdom of Navarre.
He was the fifth and the youngest
child.

1584 Xavier, Loyola and five others
founded the society of Jesus (Jesuits)

1512 Xavier arrived in GOA on May 8th and
spent 5 months in preaching and ministering to the sick in
the hospitals. He used to go through the streets ringing a little
bell and inviting the children to hear the words of God.

1552 While trying to gain entrance to mainland China, Xavier died
of a fever on Dec 3. He was buried on the island and his body was placed in
quicklime to hasten its decomposition so that it could be brought to GOA.

1622 Xavier was canonized, along with Ignatius Loyola, by Pope Gregory XV
on March 12

Goans in the Limelight

The Pennsylvania Medical Society (PAMED) has announced the winner of its 2018 **International Voluntary Service Award** winner – [Dr. Daniel Mascarenhas of Northampton County](#).

One more crown for our very own Goan, Easton physician!

Daniel Mascarenhas, MD, a cardiovascular disease specialist, won the award for his volunteer work with providing affordable cardiac care in India.

Dr. Mascarenhas founded the **Goa-America Heart Foundation, Inc**, a non-profit organization that places a strong emphasis on education, prevention, diagnostics, cardiovascular interventions, and after-care.

He also set up a **pacemaker bank at Holy Family Hospital, Mumbai, India**. This bank repurposes pacemakers collected in the U.S., re-sterilizes them in India, and implants them for indigent patients who would not live without one.

Dr. Mascarenhas has been recognized by numerous professional circles for his work with repurposed pacemakers.

- In 2012, Dr. Mascarenhas published data from patients who received these devices in India for articles in both the *Annals of Internal Medicine* and the *American Journal of Cardiology*.
- In 2018, he spoke on the subject at the Heart of Rhythm Society's annual meeting.

Dr. Mascarenhas of Navelim, Goa also set up the **St. Vincent de Paul Free Clinic at Davorlim, Goa, India** as well as started the **PFN Mascarenhas Cardiac Diagnostic Clinic in Panaji, Goa, India**.

In addition to being in full time private practice, Dr. Mascarenhas has an appointment as a clinical professor of medicine at Drexel University College of Medicine in Philadelphia, PA.

He is a 24-year member of the Pennsylvania Medical Society. Dr. Mascarenhas was formally presented the award at the Pennsylvania Medical Society's annual meeting in Hershey on October 27.

Facts on Hypertension?

- ◆ About **1 of 3 U.S. adults**—or about **75 million people**—have high blood pressure
- ◆ **Only about half (54%)** of these people have their high blood pressure under control
- ◆ You can have high blood pressure (hypertension) for years **without any symptoms** and called the “silent killer”

Risk factors: High blood pressure has many risk factors, including: **Race, Age, Family history, Being overweight or obese, Not being physically active, Using tobacco, Too much salt (sodium) in your diet, Drinking too much alcohol, Stress, Certain chronic conditions** kidney disease, diabetes and sleep apnea), Sometimes pregnancy contributes to high blood pressure, as well (preeclampsia)

Blood Pressure Categories



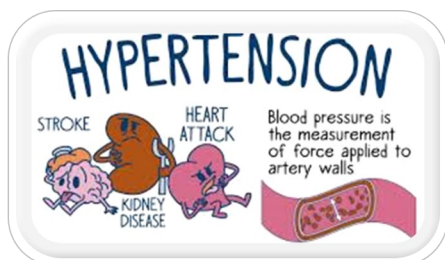
BLOOD PRESSURE CATEGORY	SYSTOLIC mm Hg (upper number)		DIASTOLIC mm Hg (lower number)
NORMAL	LESS THAN 120	and	LESS THAN 80
ELEVATED	120 – 129	and	LESS THAN 80
HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE (HYPERTENSION) STAGE 1	130 – 139	or	80 – 89
HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE (HYPERTENSION) STAGE 2	140 OR HIGHER	or	90 OR HIGHER
HYPERTENSIVE CRISIS (consult your doctor immediately)	HIGHER THAN 180	and/or	HIGHER THAN 120

Complications: Heart attack or stroke, Aneurysm, Heart failure, Chronic Kidney Disease, Stroke/TIA, Thickened, narrowed or torn blood vessels in the eyes. This can result in vision loss, Dementia

Management of Hypertension

- ◆ **Make Lifestyle Changes:** Lifestyle changes can help you control your blood pressure.
- ◆ **Diet** (Low in [salt](#) (2gm sodium diet), total fat, saturated fat, and cholesterol, high in fresh fruits and vegetables)
- ◆ **Be active.** Try taking a brisk 10-minute walk 3 times a day, 5 days a week
- ◆ **Do not smoke**

Ingredients

- 2 liters milk
- 600 gms Sugar
- 100 gms cashew nuts
- 2 tsp vanilla essence
- 2 tsp butter



Directions

1. Grind the cashew nuts fine and set aside.
2. Boil the milk in a non-stick pot.
3. Add the sugar and keep on stirring on a low flame until the milk gets a bit thicker.
4. Add the ground cashew nuts to the thickened milk and keep on stirring until the mixture looks fairly dry.
5. Add the Vanilla essence and butter.
6. Keep stirring until the mixture leaves the sides of the vessel,
7. Check the consistency by taking a small part of the mixture in a spoon, cool it slightly and try to roll it to form a ball. If it forms into a ball shape then the mixture is ready.
8. Remove the mixture from the vessel while it is still warm.
9. Roll the mixture into small balls and press into lightly greased molds OR roll out the mixture on a lightly greased board / flat surface to desire thickness and cut into small cubes / diamond shapes.
10. When cool, store in an air-tight container.

Caring Corner

Charitable Giving Hurdles and Challenges

From its inception in 1991 when GOANJ was established, there was an immediate recognition on behalf of the Planning Committee that this newly formed Association should link themselves in a charitable way with worthy causes in Goa needing special financial assistance. Hence, once we had some meager funds available (mostly due to frugal spending by the Committee, Planning Committee members shouldering some of the costs of functions, raffles and Mass collections), we were able to save up modest amounts with which to donate. Previously all you had to do was get the funds delivered! Not so anymore. The red tape and legal issues make monetary giving quite a challenge, starting the previous year.

When a foreign institution transfers funds in foreign currency to an institution in India, the Government of India requires the receiving institution to have FCRA (Foreign Currency Regulation Act) permission. Such transfer is closely monitored by the Government of India as to where the funds are being spent, thus requiring specific details of how the funds should be spent.

It is no longer as simple as selecting a worthy cause, and then underwriting some of those critical needs. Since GOANJ is a registered non-profit organization with the IRS (501-C3) we can receive a tax deduction for our individual donations. However, the challenges remain on organizations on the receiving end in Goa. Funds will be returned if the organization is not Government approved.

With this, GOANJ continues to support worthy causes. But these new strict guidelines put tight parameters on who can receive our funding. We come before our membership asking your ideas and your permission to give to a worthy cause in Goa. Over the past several years, our giving has targeted our very specific requirements: to give to a worthy cause, to foster our Goan heritage, involve education and promote our Catholic/Christian faith. Why the latter requirement if needy people in Goa require our help? The Government has tightened the guidelines giving to Catholic institutions and they have come under persecution of sorts. Hence GOANJ feels more compelled to support Church related institutions since the Government of India largely abandons them when it comes to financial assistance.

Knowing all this background which comprises the boundaries of our financial support in Goa, we come before you and ask you for your input as to what worthy Catholic-based cause might we support. Many of you are aware of our ongoing relationship with St. Xavier's Academy in Old Goa for the differentially abled students (many of whom live on campus and are later employed by the school if they are unable to find jobs after graduation). The students have come to appreciate GOANJ for their generosity (renovations to their hostel and other improvements). The children are aware of the affection and love with which GOANJ communicates and supports.

Please do let us know if there is another cause for which GOANJ can research and support with our limited financial resources. We do our very best to select, screen and hold accountable the monies sent and how they are spent. We have confidence that the monies sent to St. Xavier's is spent wisely and carefully as all monies are handled through Caritas Goa, adhering to strict guidelines.
