



Finding Home Away From Home My Experience at the Goa NJ Community Picnic 2025

As the morning sun streamed into my apartment in Broadway Astoria, I felt a ripple of excitement. It was the day of the Goa NJ Community Picnic at Rosedale Park in Pennington, NJ, a day I had been looking forward to with equal parts curiosity and nostalgia. Growing up surrounded by the warmth of Goan gatherings, I was eager to see if this picnic, miles away from home, could bring even a slice of that feeling back.

The journey itself felt like a small adventure. As I traveled from bustling Astoria to the tranquil expanse of Rosedale Park, my mind kept wandering. Would I meet people I could connect with? Would it feel like the Goa I carry in my heart?

To my surprise, from the moment I arrived, I felt none of the awkwardness of being a stranger. I didn't know anyone in the community when I got there, yet I never felt the difference. Everyone I met, from smiling families to warm-hearted fellow Goans, welcomed me as if I had always been part of the group. It was as if the shared heritage and love for our culture instantly bridged any gaps.

The park was alive with the sounds and colors of summer. Children's laughter echoed as they darted around playing games; elders sat under shady trees exchanging stories.

As the music played, sometimes lively Konkani songs, other times performances by talented musicians, I couldn't help but clap along. I joined in a spirited game of cricket with a few others and, to my surprise, ended up on the winning team! It wasn't about who won or lost, though; it was the laughter, the friendly banter, and that wonderful sense of camaraderie that made it memorable.

I also lent a hand with some activities. It felt good to be part of the effort. It reminded me that community isn't something you attend; it's something you help create.

Later in the evening, we all came together for Mass celebrated by Fr. Johnny, a peaceful and uniting moment that beautifully closed a day filled with joy and togetherness.

What struck me most was how the picnic brought together people across generations. Young children who've only known life in America, parents sharing stories of their Goan roots, and seniors who carry with them the essence of Goa's traditions all gathered under the same sky, celebrating together. For a few precious hours, it felt like a little piece of Goa had bloomed right there in New Jersey.

As the day drew to a close, I felt immense gratitude for the organizers who had made it all possible. They didn't just plan a picnic, they created a space where everyone could become friends and where a Goan like me, far from home, could feel that familiar sense of belonging.






