Movie: NACHOM-IA-KUMPASAR An Experience In Fundraising In The Age Of Social Media

Joaquim Goes

I was fourteen years old, when a schoolmate and a close friend of ours took seriously ill. The diagnosis was that he was suffering from an arterial septal defect, a medical condition also known as "a hole in the heart". The prognosis was that his chances of living were bleak unless he underwent



surgery at a specialty unit that was unavailable in Goa then in the 70s. We were told that he had to be rushed to Bombay, but his family didn't have the means to do so and neither did we and we felt helpless. That evening we cancelled our regular game of hockey and decided instead to brainstorm ideas to raise funds to help our young friend and his family, navigate through this crisis. After several ideas were tossed around, we settled on a home video screening of Richard Attenborough's award winning movie "Gandhi. In an age where internet and social media didn't exist, we had to rely on door to door visits, selling tickets to every family we knew in our village. A few days before the event when we all met again, we found out that the sales of tickets had far exceeded our expectations and we ended up having to host three back to back shows to honor all the tickets that were sold. This outpouring of support and the funds that we raised was one of most valuable life experiences that I learned at a very early age, and several valuable lessons that I learned after this first ever fund raising event have stayed with me to this day, one of these being that helping others in need is a blessing. What I also learned that fundraising is not challenging, especially if you have people on your team who are compassionate and dedicated are ever-willing to lend their time and effort to make things work.

All of our members of Saint Francis Xavier's Novena Group from Pennsylvania share these qualities. Compassion and the desire to help others in need abound. Our group presently comprises of 10 Goan families, who came together in 2014 with the purpose of assisting people with their spiritual and socio-economic needs, and to raise funds for worthy causes in Goa. The *Vision Statement* of our group reads as follows: "*Enhance the way Roman Catholic Indians in the US interact and engage to grow spiritually; and through this evolution, uplift individuals and the community (of our culture) as a whole; and be seen and perceived by others as a tightly knit community where charity begins in their homes and in their community"*. The group meets

once a month rotating in each other's homes to pray the Rosary and recite the Novena to St. Francis Xavier, followed by potluck dinner. This year-long spiritual and social process culminates in а large celebration of the Feast of St. Francis in the first week of December at a church in PA. During each of the monthly meetings, members often discuss community projects for which funds are raised primarily through contributions within the group.



In May 2017, we discussed the idea of raising funds to support institutions in Goa catering to the education and training of children with special needs. A few of our members had a priori knowledge of these institutions and were highly impressed with the dedication and the selfless service being provided to children in Goa. After we considered several fund-raising options, we settled on the idea of screening the Oscar nominated Konkani movie Nachom-ia-Kumpasar, a project that we anticipated would also serve to showcase Goa's rich Konkani music culture among the younger generation. However not too long after we made the decision to go ahead with the project, we were consumed with self-doubts, wondering whether we would be able to fill the 220 seater theater that we had booked. A cost benefit analysis undertaken within our group showed that we needed to sell about 160 tickets in order to break even. It didn't take too long to secure the support of the Goan Association of New Jersey (GOANJ) and the Goans of Upper Hudson Valley, who offered us their support to organize this event as a Konkani Lovers event, and help us with ticket sales. GOANJ went as far as to open their web-portal for on-line ticket sales, and at their annual summer picnic, we sold around 90 tickets. The following week, at the summer picnic organized by the Goans of Upper Hudson Valley in Peekskill, we sold another 80 tickets. Within two weeks after we opened the sale of tickets, we had crossed the crucial 160 mark and by the 4th week, with additional support coming from New York Goans and the Mangalorean Catholic Association, we had to consider the option of booking a second theater. Through the printing of a playbill showcasing the show and its cast, our group and our cause, we were able to secure additional pledges of support. On the day of the show we had over 300 attendees, twice the number of people that we had originally anticipated. It was an amazing sight to see so many Goan families with their children, some who had come from as far north as Poughkeepsie and Peekskill and from far down south as Delaware, Maryland and DC to attend the show and celebrate our language, culture and heritage. The movie did not disappoint and the beautiful Konkani songs captivated the audience throughout.

At the end of the show, we realized that we had truly underestimated the love that our community of Goans and Mangaloreans have for Konkani and the culture of the coastal Konkan belt. Over the course of this three month period, we made many new friends and learned through this fundraising effort that there are many compassionate people among us who share the idea that giving is a blessing and that there is great pride is helping others. Thanks to the internet and social media, we were able to reach out to many of these generous people.

We presently are corresponding with an institution in Goa called SETHU and are in discussions about funding some of its ongoing activities, as well as options of sending funds given the new restrictions on foreign fund receipts by charitable organizations in India.

Our Saint Francis Novena Group is grateful for the overwhelming support from so many Konkani enthusiasts who were generous with their time and advice. We are especially thankful to Felix Menezes, Louis D'Souza, Carmeline Baretto, Neville Mascarenhas, Chris Nunes, Wilma Pinto and several others who went above and beyond their way to help us with logistics, advertise the movie as well as sell tickets.

Halloween: A Time for Spooky Fun

Come October 31st and many countries around the world celebrate the observance of Halloween. The term "Halloween" itself is believed to have originated from "All Hallows Eve" or "All Saints Eve", which is a solemnity celebrated by the Christian Church on November 1st. On this day, Christians remember the faithful departed –canonized as well as unrecognized saints--and on the following day, November 2nd, they commemorate all deceased persons (souls). Hence, the direct relationship between Halloween and all things mystical and surreal. According to historical records, the celebration of Halloween as a pagan ritual with occult undertones traces its origin, many centuries ago, to Gaelic traditions in Ireland. Later, it is believed to have been introduced in the U.S. by Irish and Scottish immigrants, becoming a major event by the early 20th century.

The primary Halloween activity which most children (and yes, some adults too!) participate in is trick-o-treating, which allows them a unique annual opportunity to amass a treasure trove of candies in all shapes, sizes, flavors and brands. Kids usually dress in different costumes, often scary and spooky outfits, before going door-to-door in search of sweet treats. More recently, a different version of this activity has evolved and is known as 'trunk-otreating'. Car and truck owners are encouraged to decorate their automobiles and bring them to a parking lot (usually for a fee), where kids can go from one vehicle to another and collect candy from the owners. This generally serves a good purpose, since the money collected from drivers is often donated to a worthy cause or charity, whereas the children get to keep their candy. The practice is gaining in popularity, with many churches, schools and corporations participating for altruistic reasons. Other activities which both adults and kids may indulge in during Halloween include attending costume parties, pumpkin carving and decoration, scary and spooky illuminations around the house, playing pranks in the neighborhood, visiting 'haunted' attractions, watching horror films, and sometimes resorting to vandalism..

Needless to say, Halloween celebrations have acquired a significant following in recent years, primarily as a result of commercialization on all fronts. Chocolate and candy sales in the U.S. traditionally used to be highest in the month of October, until they were pushed to second position in only 2015, having been trounced by the consumption of Easter candy. Incredibly, it is reported that candy sales for these two occasions together surpass sales for the rest of the year collectively. The second commercial factor is directly related to purchases of costumes for Halloween. With adults and kids alike displaying a growing tendency to dress in fancy, and nowadays character-themed outfits for the celebration, party stores rake in massive profits during the month of October, arguably their most lucrative month in the year.

Personally speaking, as a parent, Halloween has always been an exciting time, one during which I accompany the kids on their door-to-door quest to build their annual candy cache. While they actively pursue this ephemeral passion, I wait protectively in the shadows and watch with amusement from a distance. On a parting note, I can unabashedly offer this confession: after all the candy has been collected, counted, most of it consumed by the kids, part of it donated, some shared, and the leftovers securely stashed away, I occasionally do sneak in to the pantry every other night and allow myself to indulge that recalcitrant sweet little tooth of mine. Next, our young Goan leaped on to the Konkani tiatr stage. This young lad has been around for just a decade, but is already in another musical: The Jungle Book, cast in the role of Mowgli. As my flight landed at Dabolim Airport in Goa this summer, I was anticipating a relaxing vacation to de-stress after a hectic school year, but eventually I would be surprised After spending time with my family in Panjim for a week my mother informed about a charitable

organization called the Child's Play Foundation. This organization which is based in Panjim enriched the lives of local disadvantaged children with the gift of music through several instrumental lessons. My mother figured that I would be able to

volunteer here given my years of experience in playing the piano and violin. Being my normal and lazy teenage self, I was hesitant to accept this opportunity. I figured that the purpose of the trip was to spend time with family and enjoy, more than

anything else. However, after a few days of my mother's prompting, I decided that I would meet with the founder of this organization Dr. Luis Dias to see what this organization was all about. After meeting Dr. Dias and shadowing him at one of the music lessons I was shocked to see how different life in India really was for the impoverished and disadvantaged. Up until this point, I had really never ventured out



of the protective bubble that surrounded my family to see the poorer side of Goa and noticed how difficult life was for several Goan children. These children are not able to receive the high-quality musical education

that is considered the standard in America, yet the talent that they possess is unbelievable. The way some of these children were able to pick up notes and rhythms on the violin were inconceivable to me, especially considering how it took me so long to embrace music as something I loved.

The first music lesson really caught my attention and motivated me to volunteer for the organization. I agreed to co-teach violin classes three times a

week for an hour for several children at a local school in Panjim. At times it was challenging to teach these children since most of them could only speak Hindi, a language I am far from fluent in. Even with this language barrier, I was able to effectively teach the children different pieces of music after my co-teacher helped me with translating certain phrases and words. After a few classes, I began to thoroughly enjoy helping the

children and felt that they respected and enjoyed my company as well. The time flew by and before I knew it, it was time to return to America. By helping teach these children I was able to instill positive values and provide social empowerment for these deprived children. The experiences that I gained by working with Child's Play India Foundation not only solidified my understanding of music, but gave me the opportunity to reach out towards the children in India who require help the most. In hindsight, I realized that I not only enjoyed my vacation in Goa but being a part of Child's Play added a totally different perspective to it.

Doce

Ingredients

- Sugar (750 gms) 1.5 lb
- Sugar (750 gms) 1.5 lb shredded coconu
 1 tbsp cardamom seed powder
 1 tsp salt to taste
- 1 tsp oil for greasing
- Channa daal (250 gms) 1/2 lb.
 Shredded coconut 2 lb (2 packets of fresh frozen shredded coconut from any Indian grocery store).

Method

- 1. Wash and boil the channa daal with very little water (in the cooker about 5 whistles). The daal should be soft. Grind to an almost dry paste.
- 2. Thaw and grind the shredded coconut to a fine paste
- 3. Mix channa daal, coconut and sugar. Cook on slow flame, keep stirring until the mixture is almost dry and forms a dough consistency and you can form a ball. Add the cardamom and salt.
- 4. When done, whilst still hot roll the dough on a flat surface. Place parchment paper on kitchen counter, grease a little oil on the paper so the shapes can easily be removed later, place dough and using a rolling pin, roll to a 1 cm thick sheet of dough. Use a small piece of parchment paper or foil or a large leaf to polish the surface of the doce to give it a shine. You may also use a fork to form light design lines - and then using a sharp knife, cut into crisscross diamond shapes. Let it cool completely then separate the shapes, let them dry.
