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Our Annual Lenten Retreat Speaker: Dr. Jayanand

What is a Retreat and why do we need one, at least once a year? Retreat is an action of withdrawing ourselves from the world's hustle and bustle, to spend time examining ourselves especially in our relationship with

Doctor's Advice: Healthy and Helpful Tips from our GOANJ *Dotor*

How common is colon cancer?

Approximately 130,000 people will be diagnosed with colon cancer this year and close to 50,000 people will die from colon cancer in 2018. Colon cancer has dropped from the 2nd to the 3rd leading cancer cause of death in the US as rates have been decreasing. We believe this is because of colon cancer screening and surveillance.

Recently there have been news stories about more young people being diagnosed with colon cancer. Is this true and is it known why this is happening?

The age of onset does appear to be dropping, but it is still much more common in people over age 50. The reasons are unclear but may be due to poor diet and lack of exercise. Because more young people are being diagnosed with colon cancer it is very important for young people to tell their doctors if they have blood in their stool, abdominal pain, change in bowel habits, or weight loss.

Is colon cancer more common in either gender or any particular race or ethnic groups? Men outnumber women but not by that much. Overall lifetime risk is 1 in 22 for men and 1 in 24 for women. African Americans have an increased risk of colon cancer and should start colon cancer screening 5 years earlier at age 45. Ashkenazi Jews also have an increased risk.

What are some risk factors for colon cancer?

Risk factors we have control over: Physical inactivity, being overweight, smoking tobacco, heavy alcohol intake, and a diet that is high in red meats and low in fiber, fruits, and vegetables. Risk factors we don't have control over: Being older, having a personal history or family history of colon polyps or colon cancer, having inflammatory bowel disease (Crohn's or ulcerative colitis), having an inherited syndrome like Lynch syndrome or familial adenomatous polyposis (FAP).

What age should colon cancer screening start?

Anyone over age 50 should be screened. African Americans should start screening at age 45. If one has a first degree relative with colon polyps or colon cancer, we suggest a colonoscopy at 40 or 10 years younger than the youngest first degree relative was diagnosed (whichever is earlier).

What positive steps can people take to reduce their risk of developing colon cancer?

Get regular exercise, quit smoking, avoid heavy alcohol intake, eat a high fiber diet with lots of fruits and vegetables and less red meat, and get regular screening colonoscopy after age 50 (or sooner if you have symptoms or a family history).

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Pork Vindaloo

Anonymous GOANJ 'Chef'

Ingredients

1lb. pork12 Kashmiri chillies4-5 pepper corns1 tsp cumin seeds12 cloves1/4 cup vegetable oil

pod garlic
5 to 2 in. ginger
tsp turmeric powder
Tsp sugar
Tsp white vinegar
Salt to taste

Directions

- 1. Grind the ingredients in vinegar to make a paste.
- 2. Trim and cut the pork meat 1—1.5 in. pieces and par boil the meat.
- 3. In a vessel, fry the ground paste well.
- 4. Add the meat.
- 5. Add vinegar if needed.
- 6. Cook till done.
- 7. Serve with rice or crusty rolls.
